Keep parents informed of their child's progress by meetings, reports and letters.</li> <li>6. Keep parents involved with the life of the school.</li> <li>7. Provide parents with information about the school via the school website and school correspondence before the child's entry to the school.</li> <li>8. Ensure that the building is warm, welcoming, clean and safe.</li> <li>9. Give special help to pupils as needed.</li> <li>10. Set and mark homework regularly.</li> <li>11. Follow up any absence or lateness which has not been explained.</li> <li>12. Ensure that your child attends regularly and on time, equipped for the day's work including indoor and outdoor PE kit.</li> <li>3. Inform the school by 'phone or visit' of the reason for absence on the first day and follow this with a note confirming the absence when the child returns to school.</li> <li>4. Make the school aware of any problems or concerns that might affect your child.</li> <li>5. Support our behaviour policy.</li> <li>6. Support our anti-bullying policy.</li> <li>7. Support our uniform policy and ensure all belongings are named.</li> <li>8. Create the best possible conditions for homework and ensure homework is completed on time.</li> <li>9. Attend meetings that involve your child.</li> <li>10. Have respect and tolerance of other' views.</li> </ol> <p><b>School Council would like to add:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Make sure we get enough sleep (get to bed on time) and ensure that we have a good breakfast and healthy lunch.</li> <li>2. 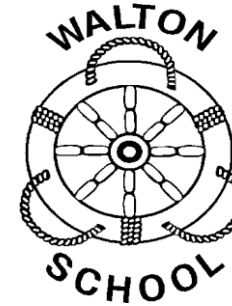
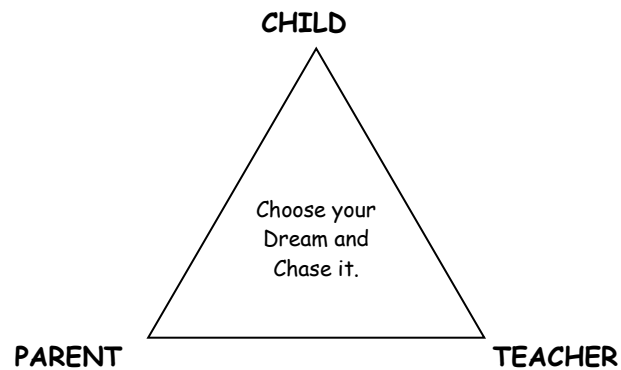
