<p>1 Look on the World Book Day website. Choose an activity or a video. Listen to a podcast, read a book review or complete a book quiz.</p>	<p>2 Create a quiz about healthy food.</p>	<p>3 Visit Frinton or Walton library and just spend time enjoying the books. You could try and find a new author? Are there any information books about healthy food? Can you find poems about food? Can you find a book about the country where your favourite fruit grows?</p>
<p>4 Use the internet or visit the library to gather information about the human skeleton. Your homework can be simply reading the information. Or drawing and labelling what you found out. Or making a skeleton model showing the main bones that support and protect the body and its organs.</p>	<p>5 In class we are going to try and find out if water travels through the stem and up in to the petals of a flowering plant. You can try out some ideas at home first if you would like to. Or you can wait until we have done this at school and then show your family what you learnt. You can write what about what you told them or draw a labelled diagram. Or you can video or photograph your experiment.</p>	<p>6 When your family go to the shops to buy food ask if you can come to. Remember to behave very well. Look at some of the labels and find out which foods have travelled from another country. Hint: The fruit and vegetables should have some interesting results.</p>
<p>7 How many healthy foods can you find in your home? Record them any way that you would like. You could write them like a shopping list or draw them in a healthy poster. Can you write them in alphabetical order?</p>	<p>8 How many foods can you list that come from plants? eg chips are made from potatoes. Potatoes grow from the underground stem of the potato plant. You can write an alphabetical list or draw diagrams to show the food and its plant.</p>	<p>9 Choose a plant to copy and draw. It could be in your home, on your walk to school, in a garden or an image on the internet. You can colour it if you would like to. Can you name the plant? How many parts of the plant can you label?</p>

<p>7</p> <p>Pretend you are a restaurant owner. You sell delicious pizzas. Some people like to have just part of a pizza. (A whole one is too much for them.) Draw a menu showing all the fractions and prices of pizza your customers can choose from. eg Cheese and Tomato $\frac{1}{2}$ = £5 $\frac{1}{4}$ = £2.50 $\frac{1}{8}$ = £1.25 Its up to you how much they cost and which fractions you use but you need to draw the pizza too.</p>	<p>8</p> <p>Copy Andy Warhol and design your own Pop Art picture. Use food like we did at school or choose your own objects eg a vehicle, a plant, an animal. Remember to make the picture really simple and clear. Copy the picture three times. Choose colours that you can mix and match across each picture. Or choose one object and make it pop out with a bright funky background. The object can be its real colours or you can change the colours.</p>	<p>9</p> <p>Design a healthy packed lunch. Choose how to record it:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Actually make your healthy packed lunch and bring it in to show me. You will need to be able to tell me why it is healthy. • Draw it in your homework book. <p>Use modelling materials to make model food and display them in a pretend lunch box.</p>
