Choose colours that you can mix and match across each picture.</p> | <p>3 We will be learning about shape before Christmas. Leading up to Christmas we will be learning about Geometry. In particular horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines. Right angles in shapes. Can you make a poster to explain what all or some of these mean? Include pictures of real life objects.</p> |
| <p>4 On Monday 2nd December we will put up some decorations in class in order to celebrate Christmas. You can make a decoration of your choice to put on the tree or to hang up in class. This can be as simple as a snowflake or as complex as a model nativity scene.</p> | <p>5 Visit Frinton or Walton library and just spend time enjoying the books. You could try and find a new author? Are there any information books about artists? Can you find poems about Christmas?</p> | <p>6 Towards Christmas we will be making something delicious to eat in class. At home can you make some food with your adult. This can be as simple or complex as you like. A sandwich through to a Christmas cake! You could photograph what you made or draw it or write out the recipe.</p> |
