<p>English David Attenborough is a famous Natural Historian and TV presenter. He has been involved with many nature programmes- lots to do with the Poles. Write a biography of David Attenborough. Put your research in to your own words but you can present the information how you choose.</p>	<p>English Time yourself for 2 minutes and see how many nouns you can write down in that time- you can only write nouns that you can see, for example if you were in the classroom you would be able to write down chair, table, whiteboard... Then time yourself again to see how many adjectives you can write that could be used to describe these nouns, for example hard, green, big, round... Keep going with verbs that describe how someone could move. For example run, hop, slink, tiptoe...</p>	<p>Maths We will be looking at time in our lessons. Write a series of activities and the time you did them as you do them throughout the day. The activities do not all have to be from one day or in order, but you can keep adding to the list over time. To challenge yourself, write the time in a variety of ways For example Brush my teeth- 7:31,32 minutes past seven. Eat dinner- 5:30, half past 5, 17:30</p>	<p>Maths Long division is an important method of calculation in year 6. Please practice the correct method as taught in class. Complete the questions about long division method. You can complete all questions, if you wish to challenge yourselves! 😊</p>
<p>Geography Stand in the middle of a room or somewhere outside where there are lots of things to see. Write down what you can see at the compass points we have been practising. You can do this by drawing what you can see and labelling it with the compass directions. I have started an example for you. Remember to also include North East, South East, South West and North West North Window West ME East Lamp South</p>	<p>History- Primary sources are often objects that we can see that tell us how people used to live or give information about a time in history. Imagine your life is being studied in the future. What primary sources could be used to help someone learn how you lived. Write the object and what it could tell someone about the way you lived. For example- IPad- people used tablet computers to use the internet, play games and communicate with people. Football- people used a ball to play a game involving many players. Netball bib- people wore bibs to let other know what team they were on and what position they played.</p>	<p>PSHE We have been practising mindfulness in class for times when we need to feel calm, to help us through a tricky time or just to have some peaceful time. Have a go at this at home- mindfulness could be free drawing different shapes on paper and carefully colouring them in, having a nature walk- listening to all the different sounds, have a trip to the beach and focus on the sounds of the waves or any other activity that can help you feel calm. Write in your homework book about the activity you tried or any new ideas you would like to share.</p>	<p>PSHE As you have now heard what secondary school you will be attending, take some time with your adults to write down any questions or queries you have about moving on to secondary school. I will then try my best to answer the questions that come in myself or try to find out the answer for you.</p>
<p>DT To add to our display of igloos, now use your knowledge of Inuits or through further research have a go at constructing another Arctic or Antarctic themed model- this could be something to do with an expedition or something that the Inuits use, for example. If you would like to draw a picture instead, these could also be added to our display.</p>	<p>Art We have been looking at symmetrical patterns in nature – snowflakes. Create a series of sketches of symmetrical patterns. You can use nature as an inspiration or complete some further research – how many lines or rotational symmetry does your pattern have?</p>	<p>Computing Design a poster using a program such as Publisher or Word to practise your digital literacy skills. The poster can be about anything you are interested in- a favourite hobby, TV programme, a subject you are interested in. Make sure it includes pictures and writing.</p>	<p>PE Have a look at BBC Super Movers and have a go at their keep active videos. They can be used to help learn your times tables, practise English skills or to just get moving. Write down the ones you tried in your homework diary.</p>
