Can you make some salt dough and make your own fossils?

If you don't have the internet you can still make some salt dough fossils by following this recipe.

You will need:

- 150g of plain flour
- 200g of salt
- ½ cup of water
- Mini plastic animals (eg insects or dinosaurs)

How to make the salt dough:

Add the flour and salt into a bowl.

Add water slowly and mix up into a ball of dough. Knead the dough like bread until your hands are no longer sticky.

How to make the fossils:

Break off balls of dough

Flatten them a little with the palm of your hand

Press a plastic insect or dinosaur into the dough


Take the toy out

Place your dough creations onto a baking tray and bake at 100 degrees C or gas mark ½ for 2-3 hours or until hard. Or they will become hard in 1 to 2 days if you leave them somewhere warm in your home.

### Maths
