English

Poetry- linked to London During the Blitz

Discursive text— this topic there will a strong focus on discussion skills across many of the areas studied on the home front

Geography

We will be using atlases to locate the countries involved in World War Two.

Physical geography— the changing land use in cities and the countryside between the 1940s and the modern day will be investigated. The land use will also be considered when discussing why it was the cities bombed during the blitz and not the countryside.

Comparison of rural/urban locations— following the journeys of evacuees in the war. Where did they come from? Where did they evacuate to? How was life different in the countryside compared to
