Ensure that the building is warm, welcoming, clean and safe. 9. Give support to pupils as needed. 10. Set homework which enhances school learning. 11. Follow up any absence or lateness which has not been explained. 12. Have respect and tolerance of other' views. School Council would like to add: 1. Provide fun ways of learning. 2. Make sure we know what our next steps are (feedback)	1. Agree to support the aims and values of the school. 2. Ensure that your child attends regularly and on time, in school uniform, equipped for the day's work including indoor and outdoor PE kit. 3. Inform the school by email, phone or visit of the reason for absence on the first day and follow this with a note confirming the absence when the child returns to school. 4. Make the school aware of any problems or concerns that might affect your child. 5. Support our Behaviour Policy and promote our school values. 6. Agree to our Anti-Bullying policy. 7. Support our Uniform Policy and ensure all belongings are named. 8. Enjoy and share reading with your child. 9. Attend meetings that involve your child. 10. Have respect and tolerance of other's views. School Council would like to add: 1. Make sure we get enough sleep (get to bed on time) and ensure that we have a good breakfast and healthy lunch. 2. Make sure we have the correct school uniform.	1. Attend school, be on time and be ready to learn. 2. Do their best and make every effort to produce class work and homework of a high standard and ensure homework is handed in on time. 3. Behave sensibly, considerately and be kind to others. 4. Show respect to everyone within the school and for the school building and equipment. 5. Take responsibility for belongings e.g. PE kit and uniform. 6. Be good ambassadors for the school. School Council would like to add: 1. Do our best at all times and be kind to one another.
