

English Read for 20 minutes every day and record this in your reading records, these need to be in school every day). Practise spellings we have been learning each week (these will be sent home weekly). Learn the year 5/6 spellings	Music Take time to listen to different genres of music and consider what is similar and what is different about them. You could compare classical with rock, jazz with pop, opera with songs from musicals. Consider: How does the piece make you feel? What instruments are being used? When do you think it was written? Who do you think likes to listen to this style of music?	Maths Use Timetables Rockstars to keep your mental skills quick and accurate. Review your answers in the weekly maths arithmetic test. This should take no longer than 20 minutes.
PSHE Create a poster to show how we can develop our self-control and self-discipline.	Geography Research the life and times of a famous explorer. Where did they go? How did they travel? What did they find? What is their legacy and why are they famous?	Science Write a biography about Carl Linnaeus, his work on classification and his binomial system.
