This can be as simple as a snowflake or as complex as a model nativity scene.</p>	<p>5 Choose a book and find somewhere comfy to sit and read. You can do this alone or with a member of your family. They can read to you or you can read to them.</p>	<p>6 Towards Christmas we will be making something delicious to eat in class. At home can you make some food with your adult. This can be as simple or complex as you like. A sandwich through to a Christmas cake! You could photograph what you made or draw it or write out the recipe.</p>
